

The Last Supper

Free Devotional for Children



Note to Parents

This is an interactive devotional. You will have a Last Supper, wash each other's feet, and sing a hymn. I encourage you to read through each scripture and lesson ahead of time, so you can plan ahead.

Here are some tips for some of the devotionals:

Day Two- The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper, also known as the Last Supper, is a very special meal Jesus shared with His disciples. As you prepare to commemorate this special meal, bring out the fancy dinnerware! Spread a lovely tablecloth, light a few candles, and use your finest dishes. I would recommend using unleavened bread such as Matzo crackers, flour tortillas, or Gordita's. When purchasing juice, go for a redder, 100% variety, since it is representative of the blood of Jesus.

Day Three- Jesus washes the disciple's feet

Prepare ahead by warming water and locating a large basin or bowl. You will also want to grab a long towel that you can easily wrap around your waist. I would also suggest grabbing a couple of extra towels, because, well, kids and water 😊

Day Four- The Last Supper ends—with a song!

You will want to have a hymn picked out for your family to sing/learn. I know hymns might seem old fashioned, but they are beautiful, classic songs that are wonderful for worship! Reawaken Hymns on YouTube is a wonderful channel for old-fashioned hymns with a slightly modern, acoustic feel. Most hymn lyrics can be found online as well. You can pull up a video on YouTube, print out the lyrics, and create a wonderful memory with your family.




Day One- Jesus announces the betrayer

Scripture: Mark 14:12-21

“The night before He was crucified, Jesus and His disciples had gathered together to celebrate the Passover. In Bible times, the Passover was a special meal held every year by the Jews. It was a memorial to God for passing over the houses of the children of Israel and sparing the lives of their firstborn child.

Jesus and His disciples were sitting around the table, enjoying their meal, when Jesus suddenly announced that one of the disciples would betray Him. This made the disciples upset and, one-by-one, they started questioning Jesus and asking if they would be the one that would betray Him. Jesus knew who would betray Him. Do you know who it was?”



Day Two- The Lord's Supper

Scripture: Mark 14:22-25 (Read the following paragraph first and then read the indicated verses)

“The Lord’s Supper is very special to Christians because it was the last meal Jesus had with His disciples before His death. Today, we are going to have our own Lord’s Supper.”

Read Mark 14:22 and then join hands and pray over the meal. Pass out pieces of the unleavened bread and explain that you are eating this bread in remembrance of Jesus.

Read Mark 14:23-25 and thank the Lord for the juice. Pass out small cups of juice to each family member and explain that you are drinking this juice in remembrance of the blood that Jesus shed for all our sins.

You may end the meal here, or perhaps sit and discuss your favorite stories of Jesus.



Day Three- Jesus washes the disciple's feet

Scripture: John 13:1-5; 12-17

“Back in the days of Jesus, everyone walked everywhere. The roads were very dusty, and it was customary to wash your feet when you went into someone’s home. If the host was rich, a servant would wash your feet for you. Jesus washing the feet of the disciples was considered very improper.

Why do you think Jesus washed His disciple’s feet? It was to show them that He loved them and He was there to sacrifice Himself for them. The entire time that Jesus walked on earth, He was always doing things for others. He would teach them, serve them, heal them, love them, and most of all, save them from their sins.

Today, we are going to do as Jesus did and wash each other’s feet. This is to show our love and service for each other and to remember what Jesus did for His disciples.”

Pour lukewarm water in a large bowl or basin and wrap a long towel around your waist. One-by-one, wash each family member’s feet and dry them. Continue until every person has washed each other’s feet. I know it might be tempting to be silly and tickle each other’s feet, but try to keep in mind the reason that Jesus washed His disciple’s feet.



Day Four- The Last Supper ends—with a song!

Scripture: Mark 14:26

Before you start the devotional, find a hymn you would like to sing/learn with your family.

“After the Last Supper and the washing of the disciple’s feet, Jesus talked with his disciples for a while. At the very end of the gathering, they did something really uplifting. They sang a hymn!

Uplifting our voice in song has always been one way we can worship God. Knowing that His Son, Jesus, sang a hymn the night before He was crucified on the cross is so inspiring! He knew what the next day would bring, yet He lifted His voice anyway!

Today, we are going to sing a hymn as we think about everything that Jesus went through—all for our salvation.”
